

LIGHT A CANDLE ON SUNDAY EVENING

Churches in Britain and Ireland have urged Christians to take part in a National Day of Prayer and Action about the coronavirus on Sunday 22 March. People are asked to light a candle in their window at 7 pm on Sunday "as a visible symbol of the light of life, Jesus Christ".



The call has been issued by the presidents of the ecumenical grouping Churches Together in England. As well as calling for prayer for the Government and those working to contain the virus, such as health-care workers, and those who are most vulnerable, the statement lists some actions that Christians might take: "Alongside your prayers, take the opportunity to telephone or email someone who is isolated, buy some additional food for your local foodbank, or offer to deliver shopping for an elderly neighbour."

The statement urges churches to follow Government health advice: "Wisdom and flexibility about worship gatherings are a key part of our Christian discipleship during this period."
