Reflection

"Hi Grace!"

"Hi Dad, thanks for coming to pick me up from school."

"That's OK my love. How was your day?"

"Good."

"What did you learn today?"

"Nothing."

"Did you eat your lunch?"

"Maybe."

"Well, did you have fun?"

"Sort of I guess."

"I see. OK, tell me what was different about today."

"Well, I got a button to put in the kindness jar."

"Right, that's good. What's the kindness jar?"

"Every time someone in the class does something kind we put a button in the jar. When the jar is full we all have a party!"

"Ooh that sounds exciting. So what did you do that was kind?"

"I helped Ethan. He fell over in the playground and cut his knee. I went over to him and took him to the first aider."

"Ah right, that was kind. So why did you decide to help him?"

"Well, he kind of fell over right next to me and he was crying and snotty and his leg was bleeding, so I thought I should probably help him."

"Mmm yes, Well done. That was a kind thing to do. Remind me, wasn't Ethan the boy who pushed you over and called you stupid last week?"

"Erm...yes. But I try not to think about that too much."

"Yes, right. Good idea. Sounds sensible to me."

"I guess so. Mrs Herrera says that all kindness is good kindness, but the best kindness is when you're kind to people you don't like. Like the people that really annoy you. Ethan really annoys me. But Mrs Herrera says that the kindness is sort of bigger than the 'not liking'."

"I see, Mrs Herrera sounds like she knows a lot about kindness."

"Maybe, I think so. She knows a lot about maths anyway. What's for dinner?"

"Whatever you want my love. I'm very proud of you."

Then the King will say to the people on his right, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father! Come and possess the kingdom which has been prepared for you ever since the creation of the world. I was hungry and you fed me, thirsty and you gave me a drink; I was a stranger and you received me in your homes, naked and you clothed me; I was sick and you took care of me, in prison and you visited me.'

Across the team there are 206 primary school children receiving free school meals and we plan to provide each family with a hamper. I calculate that we will need approximately £2000 to cover the costs. So far we have received in excess of £1300 through donations.

I am pleased (and slightly shocked!) to have been invited by Bishop James to accept appointment as an Honorary Canon at Rochester Cathedral, one of four others appointed in the present round.

The Bishop has indicated that amongst other things, this is in particular recognition of my ministry within the Bexley Team which he sees as "offering a model of such a collaborative structure within the Diocese."

The College of Canons is part of the Cathedral's governance structure, so I will be involved in occasional meetings and worship services and will be asked to preach at the cathedral once or twice a year. Date of Installation is not certain – given the present circumstances.
